Program Admission Pre-condition	The individuals having undertaken a contest in the creative tour and having passed Unified National Exams shall be enrolled into the Program (by indicating a concentration). The persons having been granted with the right to get enrolled in Higher Educational Institutions without taking Unified National Exams will only undertake a creative tour. Creative Tour on the above-mentioned academic program shall be held before the National Exams to examine Artistic Skills.								
Employment Area	After undertaking an Academic Course and being granted with a relevant specialty the graduate will be able to self-actualize: in Drama and Puppet Theatres; Cinematography; TV Plays; Show Programs; Culture Institutions (Culture and Art Centres); Individuals Creative work.								
Program Aim	The aim of the Bachelor's Educational Program in the Acting Art (Drama and Cinema Acting; Drama and Puppet Theatre Acting) is to: Educate the Artists in respect with the principles of Georgian National Theatre School. Mastering of the program will enable the students to get in depth knowledge of the actor's profession, as well as its role of the actors in the visual, in particular state theatre art. Program is oriented on mastering skills and abilities necessary for the profession and will develop professional skills among the artists as well as the skills for self-actualizing them in practice. The program will support formation of the creative individualism among the students. The aim of the program is to introduce the student basic genres of the stage art, as well as their differentiating features and peculiarities, basic principles of the artistic work. The program also aims at mastering the students' basic elements of the acting mastery, to develop a creative fantasy and fictional imagination among them; to prepare future artists for getting reflected into creating artistic personality and practical realization of one's own face. The program also aims at upbringing active artists, being able to work individually, as well as in the creative team (in the Theatre, Shooting arena in cinema and TV staging). The program also pre-considers direct practical-creative artistic courses (Artistic Mastery, Stage Speech, Rhythmic, stage movement and others), as well as theoretical courses, which will give the graduates – future artists – a Basic Humanitarian Education. The aim of the program is to prepare highly-qualified staff members in the sphere of theatre meeting the interests of the country, region and the society. The program also aims at up-bringing modern theatre and cinema professional practicing artists, which as the result of the professional and general competences obtained through mastering the programs will be oriented on modern demands of the employment market.

	Learning Outcome
Knowledge and Acknowledgement	The graduates will: Have theoretical and practical knowledge of the acting art, general and field competences of the artist's profession (drama, cinema, and puppet). The graduates will have mastered basic principles for working with the Director, creating stage image, organic performance at the stage/shooting arena, as well as relationship with partner. The graduates are well aware of the essence of the acting art, fictional-aesthetic and genre peculiarities of the performance/film, the role of the theatre art and its function in the public life. The graduates are equipped with the skills for creative critical thinking and analysis. Basic Humanitarian Educational is absolutely necessary for the future artists.
Skill for applying knowledge into the practice	The graduates are able: To practically apply necessary professional skills and creative abilities in the modern drama/puppet theatre, cinematography. The graduate has ability to fully reveal his/her own creative potential (acting mastery, stage speech, plastics, and musicality). The graduate is able to understand the role in pursuant with the staging concept, to interpret it and to create a complete stage image. The graduate is able to organically act at the stage/shooting arena, have relationship with a partner, creative groups, as well as staging director. The graduate has ability to make an emotional influence on the AUDIENCE.
Assumption Skill	The graduates are able: To collect, define and systematize the data characteristic for the field – Drawing justified conclusions. Elaboration of the relevant approaches and discussing alternative opportunities. The graduates have the skill for analysing obtained outcomes and making conclusions. The graduates can evaluate the situation in respect of the intellectual, practical and psychological aspects and to correctly define the priorities on the basis of the set objectives.
